Loyola and Perdido and Loyola and Tulane is about .6 mile or a twelve minute walk for most from the Doubletree Hotel at 300 Canal Street.

Normally you'd hop on a street car that goes to Peters Street right across from it. HOWEVER, you can't do this now. There was a building collapse with fatalities along Canal Street sometime ago. The tracks are closed. There is a "bus bridge" that works around the gap. Route 46 can be

taken from Duncan Plaza. It is just to your right. (Duncan Plaza is a park just prior to City Hall.) Take 46 to Carondelet and Canal. It is the 700 block much more palatable to the Doubletree Hilton. You can still take a blue car street car from that intersection if you desire. The Peters Street is right across from the Doubletree Hotel. Service via the 46 is every twenty minutes from 5:20 am to Midnight. It runs at forty minute intervals midnight to 5:20 am. This is the same seven days per week, all night long!

We are told taxis downtown typically cost \$36 from the airport. Three or more will be billed \$15 each.

Lyft and Uber can be used. Expect at \$33 billing for that service but it can fluctuate higher if there is a high demand.

Amtrak, Megabus and Greyhound use a multi-modal approach at Union Passenger Terminal 1201 Loyola. It is to your right from Tulane and Loyola past City Hall.

Megabus runs express buses once per day. One run is Houston, Baton Rouge to New Orleans. Another starts in Atlanta, it stops to pick up and discharge in Montgomery, AL and Mobile, AL only.

Amtrak runs three trains into New Orleans. Sunset Limited goes all the way to Los Angeles with interim stops. The fabled City of New Orleans drops down from Chicago largely parallel to the Mississippi. A third train cuts thru the southeast from Washington, DC. Cities such as Atlanta, Birmingham and Greenville and Spartanburg are served on the way.

To reach the Doubletree, take a streetcar outside the terminal, Bay 1 every half hour, twenty-four hours day. Get off at Tulane and Loyola. Make your way about one block back to Duncan Plaza. From there, take the 46 south to Canal and Carondelet. You are left with four blocks from the 700 block of Canal Street to the hotel at 300 Canal Street. Or hop a blue streetcar and get off at Peters Street across from the Doubletree at your pleasure.
